Due to the generosity of donors, Journalism Studies is fortunate to offer a number of scholarships to help undergraduate students continue their education. To be considered for scholarships offered through the University and College of Liberal Arts, including those for current students in Journalism Studies, continuing students must complete the University Scholarship Application (<https://uwide.tamu.edu/>) during the annual application window October 15 to February 1.

Incoming and transfer students may apply for all other scholarships as part of the ApplyTexas/Coalition application. Both are common applications; students complete one application in order to be considered for any scholarships for which they qualify.

Laurie & Homer '87 Jacobs Scholarship for Journalism

Homer Jacobs was the Battalion student newspaper editor at Texas A&M before moving on to a journalism career that included time as a newspaper sports editor before joining the 12th Man Magazine at Texas A&M. This scholarship was established in Jacobs' honor after his unexpected death in 2014. This is a need- and merit-based award for full-time continuing majors in Journalism Studies.

Charean Williams '86 Scholarship for Journalism

Graduating in three years, Charean Williams moved on from being assistant sports editor at the Battalion student newspaper to breaking barriers as an award-winning sports reporter covering the NFL for more than 30 years. Williams gifted this need- and merit-based award for continuing majors in Journalism Studies.

Audrey Cardenas '88 Memorial Scholarship

The Cardenas Scholarship honors Audrey Cardenas, a 1988 graduate slain while jogging in Belleville, Ill. At the time of her death, she had begun a yearlong internship with The Belleville News-Democrat. Capitol Cities Newspapers gifted the scholarship in Ms. Cardenas' memory. This is a need- and merit-based award for continuing majors in Journalism Studies.

Bob Rogers Endowed Memorial Scholarship

The Former Journalism Students Association established this scholarship to recognize Bob Rogers, a former journalism professor and head of the Department of Journalism, known for the guidance and friendship he offered students. This is a need- and merit-based award for continuing full-time majors in Journalism Studies.

Bill Robinson Endowed Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship honors Bill Robinson, who died in a traffic accident shortly before assuming the editorship of the Battalion in 1984. The Robinson family endowed the scholarship in his memory. This is a need- and merit-based award for juniors and seniors majoring in Journalism Studies with at least a 3.00 GPA.

Kyle David Tilton '89 Memorial Endowed Scholarship

This scholarship honors Kyle Tilton '89, who died at an early age while working for CBS in New York City. His family endowed the scholarship in his memory. This is a need- and merit-based award for continuing majors in Journalism Studies.

Sue & Willard Clark Scholarship

This scholarship honors Willard and Sue Clark. Willard Clark, an Aggie who represented Taylor Publishing Co. when it published the Aggieland, was a strong supporter of the Department of Journalism and Texas A&M. This is a need- and merit-based award for continuing majors in Journalism Studies.

Lee "Pete" Wright '54 Journalism Scholarship

Journalism alumni Hal Schade, Class of '67, endowed this scholarship in honor of Lee R. "Pete" Wright, Class of '54, a fellow Army veteran and loyal Aggie who encouraged Schade to give back to the University they both loved. This is a need- and merit-based award for continuing full-time majors in Journalism Studies.
